



Going by the hour

Going by the time is a relatively new concept to bowling. Please read below on how the hour works.

During most open bowling times there is a game and an hour option. Only on Friday and Saturday nights during Cosmic Thunder is there only the time option.

How it works if you bowl by the hour:

- The cost listed is per lane – Not per person.
- To get a per person cost, divide the hourly price by the number of people. You can have 6 people max per lane
- More than 6 people require the purchase of another lane, so it would be the hourly rate x2, x3, x4 depending on how many lanes you needed.
- The hourly rate does NOT include shoe rental
- The time for the hour starts with rolling the first ball down the lane
- Once the hour is up the machine will shut off, and additional time can be purchased. *Please note: you DO NOT have to purchase an hour every time. You can pro-rate the hour and add 5 minutes, 10 minutes, 15 minutes, 20 minutes or whatever amount of time your group would like to add.

FAQ's

Q: Which way is cheaper, going by the game or by the hour?

A: The rule of thumb that we use is 10 minutes per bowler per game, so 3 bowlers would take 30 minutes for 1 game. The cost is about the same either way. The faster you bowl the more bowling you would get in, so speedier or seasoned bowlers tend to get more bowling in going by the hour.
